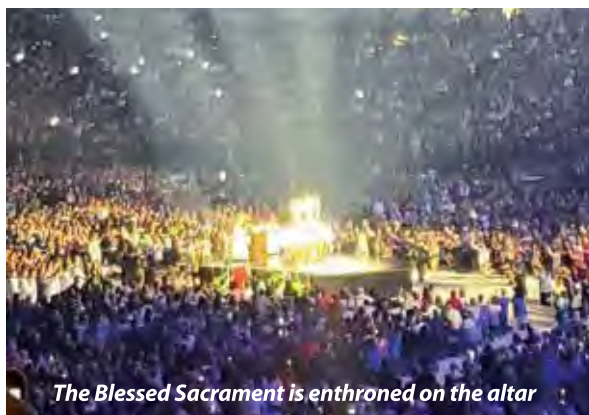
NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

There are so many thoughts and reflections that have gone through my mind and heart since Pentecost weekend when the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage began, which formed a cross over the United States concluding in Indianapolis for the Eucharistic Congress in July.

See, back when the U.S. Bishops announced the three-year Eucharistic Revival in 2022, the Son Rise Morning Show arranged to get bi-weekly updates from those leading the Revival efforts. We were among the first to hear about the plans to hold the Congress in Indianapolis, a short two-hour drive from where our studios sit in downtown Cincinnati. It was obvious that Matt and I needed to be there. Covering the Congress was truly an ora et labora experience for us.

It was also a reminder of how inherently inconvenient it is to do a syndicated morning show on the road. We had planned to broadcast from the EWTN booth in the Indiana Convention Center, but EWTN called a week before the

Congress to say that security would not be around to open the doors in time for us to do the show. So they offered us an empty hotel room across the street. Turns out that made it easier for Dominican Fr. Patrick Briscoe - who was staying in that same hotel - to join us for an hour each day. And then Benedictine Fr. Boniface Hicks was able to join us for a full hour to preview his big night leading the Litany of Healing and Eucharistic procession at Lucas Oil Stadium!

It was such a blessing to finally get to see and interview in-person so many colleagues and guests that we've known for more than a decade but had never actually seen in the flesh. And that's not to mention all the wonderful SRMS listeners who recognized us and said hello! What an experience of the Body of Christ.

Speaking of the Body of Christ, there were two moments that I'll never forget. At the first revival session, Bishop Andrew Cozzens enthroned Jesus on the altar in the center of the stadium, and an array of spotlights swirled around the stadium and lasered in on the Monstrance: It was clear from the beginning that Jesus was the Star of the show. And then on Saturday afternoon, some 50-60,000 faithful followed an estimated 1000 religious sisters, 600 seminarians, 900 priests and 200 bishops in a Eucharistic procession to a Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament, now enthroned on an altar on the beautiful Indianapolis War Memorial. It was the first time that I felt like I was experiencing something historic. I truly believe that the Lord will indeed bless our Church in the United States, and I also truly believe that the Archdiocese of Indianapolis in particular will see much fruit from hosting our Lord in the Eucharist in such a big way. And seeing as how Southeastern Indiana is in our listening area, I look forward to having a front row seat as those fruits are harvested. Deo gratias!

If there was ever a servant of God who knew how to pick up his cross and follow Christ, it was Deacon Bill Mullaney.

I had the great privilege of spending numerous hours with Deacon Bill as he recorded several different series and prayers for Sacred Heart Radio. These included reflections on Mary, The Stations of the Cross, Fallen Away Catholics, The Corporal Works of Mercy and others. His 24-part series based on the Catechism told us, "what the Church had to say" on a variety of topics. Even though serious subjects like Hell, Excommunication and The Last Judgement were covered, when discussing what

the Catechism taught about Fasting and Communion, he had a gentle way of reminding us that rushing into mass while finishing the last bite of a snack-- may not be enough time to fulfill the required one-hour fast before receiving Holy Communion.

In the early days of SHR, Deacon Bill was quite capable of climbing the three flights to our first studios in Covington and assisting at first Friday Masses at the Holy Spirit Center. But his eventual inability to walk would not stop him from preparing couples for marriage, prison ministry, organizing the Rosary Rally and preaching to parishioners at Immaculate Heart of Mary parish in Anderson Township. Deacon Bill was always one of the first to volunteer to answer phones for our Pledge Drives and I looked forward to meeting him in the parking lot because I got to drive his mobile scooter for a few minutes! He was also a 4th Degree Knight in the Knights of Columbus, Assembly 1621.



Bill was proud of his Irish heritage and was blessed to be surrounded by his wife Nancy, their five children and great grand children when he was received into eternal life-- where I suspect he joyously danced an Irish jig when he met the Lord-- as it was on St. Patrick Day!

Because of Deacon Bill's commitment to sharing the faith through the many meditations and prayers he prepared for Sacred Heart Radio, he will always be with us, proving that no matter what obstacles are in put in our path, by following the Lord Jesus, it is "the way" to eternal life—even on a scooter!
